

Dear Mr Carter

Thank you for raising RACQ's policy priorities with the LNP ahead of the 2024 state election.

Queenslanders will be asking themselves at this election whether their lives are better or worse after almost a decade under Labor and who has The Right Plan for Queensland's Future.

This election is Queensland's chance for a Fresh Start.

The Bruce Highway is critical for the prosperity of Queensland. The LNP will fight for the restoration of the 80/20 funding agreement that was abandoned by Federal Labor.

The LNP has also committed to re-establishing the Bruce Highway Advisory Council to guide future investment in this corridor. This body was abolished by Labor two years ago.

The LNP would welcome the RACQ's involvement in a re-established Bruce Highway Advisory Council.

The LNP recognises that more needs to be done to address the significant maintenance backlog on Queensland's roads. Under Labor we've seen over \$20 billion in major project blowouts on projects like Cross River Rail. These blowouts mean other vital work on our transport network is either delayed or cancelled.

As you will be aware, the LNP has committed to continuing 50 cent public transport plans. This is part of the LNP's priorities of making public transport reliable, frequent, affordable, and safe.

The LNP has also committed to delivering new regional plans to deal with the Housing Crisis that has developed under Labor's watch. These regional plans will be accompanied by an infrastructure plan to cater for growth while maintaining the lifestyle that Queensland is famous for.

After a decade of Labor, Queensland is heading in the wrong direction on the key issues of Youth Crime, Health, Cost of living and Housing.

Our State needs a Fresh Start and the LNP has The Right Plan for Queensland's Future, which includes:

- Safety where you live – through stronger laws like Adult Crime, Adult Time and gold standard early intervention
- Health services when you need them – by axing Labor's Patients' Tax, a tax which doctors have said will end bulk billing and make GP visits more expensive

- Respect for your money – by stopping Labor’s expensive budget blowouts which are pushing up costs for families
- A place to call home – by abolishing stamp duty on new builds for first home buyers
- A government that works for you – to address challenges for the long term, not band-aid solutions at election time
